THE GRAND JURORS of Tipton County, Tennessee, duly empaneled and sworn, upon their oath, present that **MICHAEL WOODS NAIFEH**, on or about February 19, 2018, in Tipton County, Tennessee, and before the finding of this indictment, did unlawfully, knowingly and pursuant to a common scheme or plan obtain property, a more particular description thereof being to the Grand Jurors unknown, valued at one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or less, of the City of Covington without its effective consent, with the intent to deprive said City of Covington thereof, and the said **MICHAEL WOODS NAIFEH** did conceal the fact of the crime, in violation of T.C.A. 39-14-103, against the peace and dignity of the State of Tennessee.

COUNT 2

And the Grand Jurors on their oath aforesaid further present that in Tipton County on or about February 19, 2018, before the finding of this indictment, the said **MICHAEL W. NAIFEH**, did unlawfully, feloniously and knowingly, while a public servant, to-wit: the Chief of the Covington Fire Department, and with intent to obtain a benefit, did knowingly receive a benefit not otherwise authorized by law, in violation of T.C.A. 39-16-402(a)(5), against the peace and dignity of the State of Tennessee.
