## The Value of Financial and Compliance Audits: Making Government Work Better

When people hear the word "audit," they might think of stress, scrutiny, and inconvenience.

In reality, an audit is a tool for improvement and accountability. Many of you have probably heard the old joke: "Hi, we're the auditors, and we're here to help." While that line usually gets a laugh, it truly reflects the spirit of what auditors are supposed to do. At the Comptroller's Office, our mission is simple: "make government work better." Financial and compliance audits are one of the most important ways we can achieve that mission. Audits should not be about finding something wrong but used to help local governments improve, protect their resources, and serve citizens more effectively.

The Division of Local Government Audit has a big responsibility. By statute, we are required to annually audit:

- All 95 counties
- 342 incorporated municipalities, and
- Roughly 1,700 additional entities such as boards, commissions, authorities, utility districts, human resource agencies, development districts, internal school funds, charter schools, special school districts, and nonprofits that receive state or federal funding

Our office directly audits 91 of the state's 95 counties. Given our lack of resources, to meet our audit mandates, we rely on CPA firms to audit municipalities and all the other local government related entities. These CPA audits are performed as part of a three-party contract between the Comptroller's Office, the local government entity, and the CPA firm. This process ensures accountability, consistency, and independence, while allowing us to meet our audit requirements.

So, how do financial and compliance audits help us "make government work better"? Well, audits serve three important purposes:

#### 1. Provide Accountability to Citizens

Taxpayers deserve to know that their money is being spent appropriately, efficiently, and for the purposes intended. An independent audit provides transparency and assurance that public funds are being properly managed.

#### 2. Improved Financial Management

Audits don't just highlight problems, they include recommendations that local officials can use to strengthen internal controls, reduce waste, and prevent fraud. For instance, an audit might identify issues such as improper segregation of duties or outdated policies and procedures. Correcting these types of issues can help local governments operate more effectively.

#### 3. Compliance with Laws and Regulations

Local governments receive substantial state and federal funding, and with those funds, they often come attached with a lot of "strings" or compliance requirements. Audits verify that those funds are used appropriately and that governments are following both state statutes and grant requirements.

In summary, audits are tools that build public confidence and help local government leaders make better-informed decisions.

To provide consistency, credibility, and reliability, our audits are conducted in accordance with professional standards established by:

- The Government Accountability Office (GAO) through the Yellow Book, which governs government auditing
- The American Institute of Certified Public Accountants (AICPA), which sets professional standards for auditors, and
- The Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB), which establishes accounting and financial reporting principles for state and local governments

Without these standards, one local government's financial report might look very different from another's, making comparisons and oversight difficult. Standards ensure that every audit, whether conducted by our office or by a CPA firm, is performed the same and the resulting audit reports

look the same. They also help maintain the public's trust that financial information is accurate and that issues are identified and addressed appropriately.

Preparation is a key factor in how smoothly an audit goes, and this is where professional certification programs add significant value. The CMFO and CCFO programs are designed to help equip finance officers with the knowledge and tools they need to manage public resources effectively. As program graduates, you learned about governmental accounting, financial reporting, internal controls, and laws governing local government finances.

When finance officers are well-trained, audits become more efficient and beneficial. Financial statements are more accurate, internal controls are stronger, and compliance risks are lower. These finance officer certification programs don't just help local governments prepare for their audits, they help them improve their overall financial health and sustainability.

Your audits should never be viewed as an adversarial process. Our goal as auditors is not to "catch" local governments doing something wrong, but to provide an independent assessment that leads to improvement. That's why the old joke about auditors being "here to help" is true. Audits create a partnership between state oversight, local governments, and citizens. They ensure taxpayer resources are used wisely, identify areas for improvement, and promote transparency. This partnership is essential to keeping government strong, effective, and accountable.

If the mission of the Comptroller's Office is to "make government work better," then audits are one of the most important ways we achieve that mission. They are not about finding fault. They are about finding solutions.

So, the next time auditors walk through your door and say, "Hi, we're the auditors, and we're here to help," remember: it's not a punchline. It's a promise!
