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Audit Highlights

Review of Funds Administered by District Attorneys General and

Judicial District Drug Task Force Funds First Through Thirty-First Judicial Districts For the Year Ended June 30, 2004

Scope

The review included an examination of funds administered by the district attorneys general for the year ended June 30, 2004. The review also included an examination of judicial districts' drug task force funds administered by the task forces' boards of directors for the year ended June 30, 2004.

Results

Eight judicial districts had findings. reviewed these findings and recommendations with the attorneys district general representatives of the Drug Task Forces. Details on these findings, recommendations, and ment's responses as a result of our examination are presented in the Findings, Recommendations, Financial Section of this report

The following are summaries of the findings from our review:

FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT:

- ♦ The Drug Task Force did not deposit receipts within three days of collection, as required by state statute.
- ◆ The Drug Task Force director did not sign the agents' activity reports for review and approval.

TWELFTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT:

- ◆ Deficiencies were noted in Drug Task Force expenditures. Original documentation was not on file in the County Mayor's Office to support some expenditures. Drug Task Force funds were used to pay monthly pager fees for the district attorney general, assistant district attorneys, and district attorney general's secretaries. Also, Drug Task Force funds were used to pay the monthly cellular telephone bills of an assistant district attorney. In addition, The Drug Task Force did not follow the state and/or local travel policies as required by grant guidelines.
- Several law enforcement agencies did not contribute to the operations of the Drug Task Force.
- The Board of Directors of the Drug Task Force did not assume sufficient oversight responsibility for the task force's operations.
- ♦ Payments made to confidential informants were not witnessed by a second agent.

THIRTEENTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT:

• The district attorney general did not maintain adequate controls over assets purchased with District Attorney General Funds. In several instances, equipment was not tagged or clearly marked as property of the District Attorney General's Office.

- ♦ In some instances, purchase orders were not issued when required or were not issued properly. Also, in several instances, copies of invoices were provided to the County Executive's Office as supporting documentation for purchases. In addition, late charges were paid on certain invoices. These late charges of \$505 are included as questioned costs. Furthermore, we noted expenditures that did not appear to be in accordance with grant guidelines. These expenditures of \$1,477 are included as questioned costs.
- ◆ Travel reimbursements were not made in compliance with the state travel policy, as required by grant guidelines. Travel reimbursements of \$338.34 are included as questioned costs. Also, proper documentation was not included on all travel reimbursement claims.
- Several assets were noted that were not tagged or clearly marked as office property, and two portable radios could not be located that were listed on the equipment inventory.
- ♦ The Drug Task Force did not monitor a subrecipient of grant funds to ensure that the federal funds were used in accordance with grant guidelines. The \$25,000 passed-through to the subrecipient is reported as a questioned cost.

FIFTEENTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT:

• The federal grant reports prepared by the Drug Task Force did not agree with the accounting records because the grant reports were prepared from records on file at the Drug Task Force Office rather that the actual accounting records maintained by the County Mayor's Office.

TWENTY-SECOND JUDICIAL DISTRICT:

• In several instances, the Drug Task Force was delinquent in paying invoices.

TWENTY-THIRD JUDICIAL DISTRICT:

♦ In some instances, payments made to confidential informants were not witnessed by a second agent.

TWENTY-FOURTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT:

♦ The Drug Task Force did not deposit receipts within three days of collection, as required by state statute.

THIRTY-FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT:

◆ The Drug Task Force (DTF) did not use drug fines and forfeitures in accordance with state statutes. The DTF expended \$1,986 for training for the district attorney, assistant district attorney, and staff of the district attorney's office relating to the

investigation and prosecution of violent crimes. In addition, the DTF purchased equipment totaling \$4,132 that was used by both the DTF and the district attorney's office. State statutes require the DTF to use drug fines and forfeitures exclusively for drug enforcement or drug education.

INTRODUCTION

This is a report of our review of funds administered by District Attorneys General and Judicial District Drug Task Forces for the year ended June 30, 2004, for the first through thirty-first judicial districts of the State of Tennessee. A separate review was conducted in each of the 31 judicial districts of the funds administered by the District Attorneys General and Judicial District Drug Task Force Funds. The results of our reviews, of the judicial districts are presented in this report.

BACKGROUND

Each judicial district comprises from one to seven counties. Main offices are generally in the county where the district attorneys general reside, with branch offices located in other counties. The district attorneys general had funds on deposit with some county trustees of the counties included in the respective judicial districts. The county trustees had one or more of the following types of funds on deposit: District Attorney General, Drug Task Force, Federal Asset Forfeiture, DUI Task Force, Metro Appropriations, Safe Neighborhood Grants, and Other Funds.

District Attorney General Fund

The District Attorney General Fund is used primarily to account for fees received from the Fraud and Economic Crimes Prosecution Act of 1984. In addition, this fund is also used to account for other sources of revenues received by the District Attorney Generals' such as investment income, miscellaneous refunds, copy fees, contributions, proceeds from confiscated property, and other local revenues.

Judicial District Drug Task Force Funds

Some judicial districts have established multi-jurisdictional drug task forces under the leadership of the district attorneys general. These drug task forces were created by contract (mutual aid agreement) between the participating district attorneys general, city and county governments, and approved by their respective legislative bodies. Each judicial district drug task force, except for the 31st Judicial District Drug Task Force, is governed by a board of directors, which generally includes sheriffs and police chiefs of participating law enforcement agencies within each judicial district. The 31st Judicial District Drug Task Force is governed by the district attorney general.

Drug task force funds are to be deposited with the county trustee in the county of each district attorney general's residence or another county designated by the district attorney general. The county trustees should credit these funds to a Judicial District Drug Fund.

All nonconfidential financial operations should be expended through these Judicial District Drug Funds under the administration of the county mayors. The directors of the drug task forces should submit requisitions to the county mayors for goods and services, which would then be obtained through the county's purchasing system. Cash transactions for confidential funds should be requisitioned and disbursed under the supervision of each drug task force director and chairman.

U.S. District Attorney General Federal Asset Forfeiture Fund

In 1984, the United States Department of Justice enacted the Comprehensive Crime Control Act, which gave the Office of U.S. Attorney General the authority to share federally forfeited property with cooperating state and local law enforcement agencies. The three primary goals of the Justice Department's forfeiture program are to punish and deter criminal activity by depriving criminals of property used for or acquired through illegal activities; to enhance cooperation among federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies through equitable sharing of assets recovered through the program; and to procure revenues to enhance forfeitures and strengthen law enforcement.

Through an agreement with the United States Department of Justice and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), the Office of District Attorney General of the Thirtieth Judicial District is participating in this forfeiture program. Under this agreement, the District Attorney General's Office has assigned to the Drug Task Force an officer who is under the direct supervision and control of DEA supervisory personnel. Upon request by the District Attorney General's Office, DEA reimburses for overtime payments made to the officer assigned to the Drug Task Force. The District Attorney General's Office deposits these reimbursement payments with the Shelby County financial director, who channels the funds through Shelby County's General Fund. Also, under this agreement, the District Attorney General's Office requests from DEA its share of property recovered through joint law enforcement activities in which the officer assigned to the Drug Task Force participates. Payments received are deposited with the Shelby County Trustee's Office into the U.S. District Attorney General Federal Asset Forfeiture Fund. Pursuant to Department of Justice policy, funds made available through this program must be used by the District Attorney General's Office for law enforcement purposes.

Through an agreement with the Internal Revenue Service, the Office of District Attorney General of the Twentieth Judicial District is also participating in the forfeiture program. Payments received by the Twentieth Judicial District are deposited to a separate fund in Metro-Davidson County and must be used for law enforcement purposes.

DUI Task Force Fund

The DUI Task Force Fund consists of DUI district fines received by the Twenty-First Judicial District.

Metro/County Appropriations Fund

The Metro/County Appropriations Fund consists of funds appropriated by the counties and cities in the Twenty-Third Judicial District.

Safe Neighborhood Grants Fund

The Safe Neighborhood Grants Fund consists of federal grant funds received by the Thirtieth Judicial District for use in a marketing campaign to reduce community gun violence.

Other Funds

Other funds reflected in the Sixth Judicial District consisted of grants from the Office of Criminal Justice Programs, including Edward Byrne Memorial Grants and matching funds from Knox County. Other funds in the Eighth Judicial District consist of law enforcement grants from the Office of Criminal Justice Programs and the City of Knoxville. Other funds in the Tenth Judicial District consist of funding from a Community Prosecution and Project Safe Neighborhoods grant received from the U.S. Department of Justice, a Edward Byrne Memorial Grant passed through the state Office of Criminal Justice Programs, and local matching funds. Other funds in the Thirtieth Judicial District consist of funds raised from contributions for a 5K run (5K Run Fund) used to benefit nonprofit agencies in the community, contributions from the City of Memphis to enhance a witness protection program (Witness Relocation Fund), and donations received from various groups to promote initiatives to increase the quality of life in certain communities located in Shelby County (Broken Window Fund).

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The various governmental funds are accounted for using the modified accrual basis of accounting.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

Total revenues and expenditures of these funds for the 31 judicial districts, as well as beginning and ending balances for the year examined, are presented below:

SCOPE

The reviews include an examination of funds administered by the district attorneys general for the year ended June 30, 2004. The reviews also include an examination of the administration of judicial district drug task force funds by the Drug Task Forces' Boards of Directors for the year ended June 30, 2004. Our reviews consisted of tests of records and auditing procedures that we considered necessary in the circumstances.

Findings and recommendations as a result of our reviews are presented in the Findings, Recommendations, and Financial Section of this report. Eight judicial districts had material findings. We reviewed these findings and recommendations with the district attorney general and representatives of the Drug Task Force to provide an opportunity for their response. The written responses from officials in the Thirteenth Judicial District Drug Task Force are included in this report. Other officials made oral responses, however these oral responses have not been included in this report.

FINDINGS, RECOMMENDATIONS AND FINANCIAL SECTION

FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT

FIRST JUDICIAL DISTRICT

FINDING 04.01 DRUG TASK FORCE RECEIPTS WERE NOT REMITTED TO THE COUNTY TRUSTEE WITHIN THREE DAYS OF COLLECTION

The Drug Task Force did not deposit funds with the trustee within three days of collection. Section 5-8-207, <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u>, requires funds to be deposited within three days of collection.

RECOMMENDATION

The Drug Task Force should deposit all funds with the county trustee within three days of collection, as required by state statute.

FINDING 04.02 AGENTS' ACTIVITY REPORTS WERE NOT SIGNED DOCUMENTING THAT THEY HAD BEEN REVIEWED AND APPROVED

The Drug Task Force director did not sign the agents' activity reports as evidence of supervisory review and approval for the period January 2004 through June 2004.

RECOMMENDATION

To strengthen internal controls, the Drug Task Force director should sign the agents' activity reports as evidence of supervisory review and approval.

TWELFTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

FINDING 04.01 DEFICENCIES WERE NOTED IN DRUG TASK FORCE EXPENDITURES

We noted the following deficiencies in Drug Task Force (DTF) expenditures:

- A. Original documentation was not on file in the County Mayor's Office to support all expenditures charged to DTF credit cards. These expenditures included charges for supplies, gasoline, Internet services, lodging, and meals. We extended our examination to determine that these goods and/or services were received.
- B. DTF funds were used to pay the monthly pager fees for the district attorney, assistant district attorneys, and the district attorney's secretaries. In addition, DTF funds were used to pay the monthly cellular telephone bill of an assistant district attorney. Since these expenditures were primarily for the benefit of the District Attorney's Office, we question the propriety of paying these expenditures with DTF funds. Chapter VI, Page 1, of the Tennessee Administrative Manual subrecipients, Byrne Formula Grants, states that purchases are to be made for the subrecipient's operation. Also, Section 39-17-420(c), Tennessee Code Annotated (TCA), states that all fines and forfeitures placed in the Drug Task Force Fund "shall be used exclusively for a drug enforcement or drug education program of the district." If the equipment and/or supplies purchased are used for both DTF and non-task force activities, the cost of the equipment should be allocated appropriately.
- C. The DTF did not comply with state and/or local travel policies as required by grant regulations. In several instances expenditures for lodging exceeded the limit established by the state and/or local travel policies. Also, meals were charged to the DTF credit card instead of reimbursing employees a per diem rate as established by the state and/or local travel policy.

RECOMMENDATION

The DTF should file detailed invoices to support all expenditures, and should make disbursements only for drug enforcement or drug education programs, as required by the Byrne Grant regulations and Section 39-17-420(c), <u>TCA</u>. If equipment and/or supplies are used for both DTF and non-task force activities, the cost of the equipment and/or supplies should be appropriately allocated. The DTF should follow the applicable state and/or local travel policies as required by grant regulations.

FINDING 04.02 SEVERAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES DID NOT PARTICIPATE IN THE DRUG TASK FORCE

During the year, the Sequatchie County Sheriff's Department was the only agency to contribute to the operations of the Drug Task Force (DTF). The Twelfth Judicial District DTF was established in 1988 by an interlocal agreement among 27 law enforcement agencies within the district. This agreement provided that each agency would support the efforts of the drug task force with financial, equipment, and/or manpower contributions.

RECOMMENDATION

The law enforcement agencies within the judicial district should review their participation in the DTF, and agencies that do not wish to participate should withdraw from the interlocal agreement.

FINDING 04.03 THE DRUG TASK FORCE'S BOARD OF DIRECTORS DID NOT ASSUME SUFFICIENT OVERSIGHT RESPONSIBILITY

The Board of Directors of the Drug Task Force (DTF) did not assume sufficient oversight responsibility for the DTF's operations. During the year examined, the board held only one meeting, and only five of the 27 participating law enforcement agencies included in the interlocal agreement attended. One meeting was not sufficient to review and approve all the task force's operations.

RECOMMENDATION

The board should meet regularly to approve and review the DTF's operations, including expenditures, personnel policies, controls over evidence and confiscations, and the status of cases. Minutes of these meeting should be documented and filed with the District Attorney General's Office.

FINDING 04.04 PAYMENTS TO CONFIDENTIAL INFORMANTS WERE NOT WITNESSED BY A SECOND OFFICER

Receipts for payments to confidential informants reflected the signature of only one officer. The Bureau of Justice Guidelines require that two agents witness payments to confidential informants.

RECOMMENDATION

The Drug Task Force director should require the signature of two officers for all payments to confidential informants.

THIRTEENTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

FINDING 04.01 THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE HAD INADEQUATE CONTROLS OVER INVENTORY

The District Attorney General's Office did not maintain adequate controls over assets purchased with District Attorney General Funds. Inventory records of assets owned by the District Attorney General's Office were maintained. However, we noted several assets on the inventory that were not tagged or clearly marked as office property. Failure to properly tag or mark assets as office property weakens control over assets.

RECOMMENDATION

To improve controls over inventory, the District Attorney General's Office should tag all assets and ensure that inventory lists include property tag numbers.

FINDING 04.02 DEFICIENCIES WERE NOTED IN THE DRUG TASK FORCE'S PURCHASING PROCEDURES

The Putnam County Executive administers purchasing for the Judicial District Drug Task Fund; therefore, the purchasing procedures are the procedures implemented by Putnam County, Tennessee. We noted the following deficiencies in purchasing procedures during our examination of the Drug Task Force:

- A. In several instances, purchase orders were either not issued when required or were not issued properly. The failure to issue purchase orders properly results in the loss of control over who has purchasing authority and the ability to document purchasing commitments.
- B. In several instances, only copies of invoices were provided to the County Executive's Office as supporting documentation of purchases. The failure to provide original documentation for purchases results in the loss of assurance that goods and services were actually received. However, we extended our audit procedures and were able to determine that goods had been received and services had been rendered.
- C. We noted that the Drug Task Force did not process payments in a timely manner resulting in late charges on several invoices. Late fees on a copier payment plan totaled \$122 and late charges on the purchase of computers from Methamphetamine Initiative Grant funds totaled \$505. The payment of late charges increases the costs of the goods and services to the Drug Task Force unnecessarily.
- D. Drug Task Force personnel did not properly monitor the Drug Task Force expenditures relating to the Public Safety Partnership and Community

Policing Grant (CFDA No. 16.710) to determine that the expenditures were in accordance with grant guidelines. As a result, the Drug Task Force purchased meals and refreshments totaling \$1,162 for meetings and training seminars that were prohibited by the grant guidelines. Also, the Drug Task Force purchased name plates (\$315) for all of the offices located at the Drug Task Force building. Grant guidelines do not allow for miscellaneous costs that do not directly lead to the implementation or enhancement of the program.

RECOMMENDATION

Purchase orders should be issued properly for all applicable expenditures. Original documentation should be maintained for all expenditures. Also, invoices should be paid in a timely manner so that late charges are not incurred. Furthermore, officials should make sure that all purchases are allowable within the program guidelines.

MANAGEMENT'S RESPONSE – (Direct Quote)

- A. Properly issued purchase orders will be used for all future transactions.
- B. Only original invoices will be provided to the County Executive's Office as documentation of all future purchases.
- C. Late charges are initiated when the processing of payments takes longer than thirty (30) days. We will make every effort to see that invoices are processed and bills paid in a timely manner to avoid all future late charges.
- D. We have reviewed the spending guidelines for the particular grant money addressed and will make no further expenditures not in full compliance with the requirements of that grant including meals for training sessions or items such as nameplates for office doors. All purchases made will be those that directly lead to the implementation or enhancement of the grant program.

FINDING 04.03 DEFICIENCIES WERE NOTED IN THE DRUG TASK FORCE'S TRAVEL DISBURSEMENTS

According to grant guidelines, the Drug Task Force is to follow the uniform travel policy for the State of Tennessee. In general, this policy allows for the reimbursement of meals when overnight travel is required with the employee receiving 75 percent of the per diem rate on the day of arrival and the day of departure. The policy also establishes limits on lodging based upon the location. We noted the following instances in which management did not adequately review the travel payment requests for compliance with the travel guidelines:

A. The Drug Task Force director, agents, a prosecutor, and two secretaries were reimbursed at 100 percent of the per diem travel rate for meals on the day of departure when they should have received only 75 percent of the daily per

- diem for meals for this day. These reimbursements resulted in total overpayments of \$79.
- B. The Drug Task Force computer specialist was improperly reimbursed at 100 percent of the per diem travel rate for meals when no overnight stay was required, resulting in a \$30 overpayment.
- C. In some instances, lodging reimbursement rates were made in excess of the amounts allowed by the state regulations, resulting in overpayments of \$210.
- D. In two different instances, phone calls from hotels totaling \$19.34 were reimbursed by the Drug Task Force; however, the per diem established by the state travel policy includes meals and incidentals such as phone calls.
- E. Proper documentation was not included on all travel reimbursement claims. In one instance, a per diem rate for out-of-state travel was not included with the travel reimbursement claim, and in other instance, travel reimbursement claims did not include original invoices for lodging.

RECOMMENDATION

Travel expenditures should be properly reviewed before payment to ensure that they are made in accordance with the state travel policies as required by the grant guidelines.

MANAGEMENT'S RESPONSE – (Direct Quote)

- A. We understand that on arrival and departure dates, travel is reimbursed at seventy-five percent (75%) of the full per diem. These inadvertent overpayments are being recovered from the employees involved and redeposited.
- B. No per diem payment is available when required travel does not mandate an overnight stay. This amount is being refunded by the Computer Specialist and re-deposited.
- C. The two hundred ten dollars (\$210.00) overpayment is being refunded by the employees involved and re-deposited.
- D. The phone calls involved have not been documented as government business, and the nineteen dollars and thirty-four cents (\$19.34) is being refunded by the employee involved and re-deposited.
- E. Proper documentation will be included with all travel reimbursement claims including original hotel bills.

The state travel regulations and policies of the Drug Task Force have been reviewed with all parties involved to insure future compliance.

EQUIPMENT WAS NOT TAGGED OR MARKED AS PROPERTY OF THE DRUG TASK FORCE AND CERTAIN EQUIPMENT COULD NOT BE LOCATED

The Drug Task Force maintained an equipment inventory; however, we noted the following deficiencies related to inventory:

- A. The Drug Task Force did not maintain adequate controls over assets purchased with grant monies. We noted several sensitive assets in the nonconfidential operations of the Drug Task Force that were not tagged or clearly marked as office property. Failure to properly tag or mark assets as office property weakens control over assets.
- B. Also, we could not locate two GTX portable radios listed on the equipment inventory.

RECOMMENDATION

Internal controls over equipment should be strengthened.

MANAGEMENTS' RESPONSE – (Direct Quote)

Internal control over equipment and inventory will be strengthened. All Task Force equipment and office property will be properly tagged.

FINDING 04.05 THE DRUG TASK FORCE DID NOT MONITOR A SUBRECIPIENT OF FEDERAL AWARDS

The Methamphetamine Initiative Grant's approved application budget included a pass-through amount of \$25,000 for the Upper Cumberland Child Advocacy Center, a subrecipient of the grant. As part of the Drug Task Force's responsibilities for providing these funds to a subrecipient, they were responsible for monitoring the use of the grant funds. However, the Drug Task Force did not ensure that federal awards were used for authorized purposes in compliance with laws, regulations, and the provisions of contracts or grant agreements and that performance goals were achieved as required by OMB Circular A-133, Subpart D, Section .400(d)(3). Since the Drug Task Force did not comply with the monitoring requirements of OMB Circular A-133, the entire pass-through amount of \$25,000 is considered a questioned cost.

RECOMMENDATION

The Drug Task Force should monitor subrecipients to ensure that federal awards were used for authorized purposes as required by federal grant regulations.

MANAGEMENT'S RESPONSE – (Direct Quote)

At the beginning of this grant period, we did not understand the requirement to monitor sub-recipients to insure that federal awards were used for authorized purposes. In compliance with grant requirements, we are now in the process of performing that monitoring with the Child Advocacy Center to insure that those funds were spent appropriately and will document those findings for our file.

The Drug Task Force did not deposit seized funds with the county trustee within three days of collection. Section 5-8-207, <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u>, requires funds to be deposited within three days of collection.

RECOMMENDATION

The Drug Task Force should deposit all seized funds with the county trustee within three days of collection, as required by state statute.

FINDING 04.01 DRUG TASK FORCE FUNDS WERE NOT USED IN COMPLIANCE WITH STATE STATUTES

The Drug Task Force (DTF) expended \$1,986 for training and travel for the district attorney general, assistant district attorneys, and the staff of the District Attorney General's Office relating to the investigation and prosecution of drug and violent crimes. In addition, the DTF expended \$4,132 for equipment that was used by both the drug task force and the District Attorney's Office. Section 39-17-420(c), Tennessee Code Annotated, provides that all drug fines and forfeitures the DTF receives be used, "...exclusively in a drug enforcement or drug education program of the district ...". Therefore, the use of DTF funds to pay for travel and equipment that was not used exclusively for drug enforcement and drug education is questionable. If the expenditure benefits both task force and non-task force activities, the costs should be allocated appropriately.

RECOMMENDATION

DTF disbursements from drug fines and forfeitures should be only for drug enforcement or drug education, as required by state statute.
