

UPDATED EDUCATION GLOSSARY FOR 2022

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The Tennessee Comptroller's Office has updated the online version of the Tennessee Education Glossary for 2022. The Comptroller's Education Glossary provides legislators and the general public with definitions of over 200 commonly used education terms and their relevance to Tennessee. The Comptroller's Office of Research and Education Accountability (OREA) regularly updates the glossary to maintain accuracy and keep up with policy changes. Glossary entries include pertinent data, legislation, and links to related OREA reports.

The 2022 update includes revisions to 48 glossary entries to incorporate up-to-date definitions, data, and relative legislation, where applicable. Updated entries include accountability, adverse childhood experiences, Drive to 55, outcomes-based funding formula, truancy, and universal screener.

Four new entries have been added as part of the 2022 update:

- *Education Recovery and Innovation Commission (ERIC)*: advisory group created by the General Assembly to address issues related to the COVID-19 pandemic
- *registered apprenticeships*: work-based learning models that combine supervised on-the-job training, paid work experience, classroom instruction, and mentorship
- *Tennessee Pathways*: a Drive to 55 initiative that supports alignment among K-12 education, postsecondary education, and industry
- *Tennessee Accelerating Literacy and Learning Corps (TN ALL Corps)*: program created by the General Assembly to support Tennessee students by providing access to tutoring in both English Language Arts and math
