Tennessee Trends

- ★ The statewide average classroom teacher salary increased by 6.2 percent between 2015 and 2018, rising from \$47,979 to \$50,958.
- ★ More than \$300 million in new, recurring state dollars was appropriated by the General Assembly between fiscal years 2016 and 2018. The legislative intent for the increased state funding was to increase teacher salaries across the state.
- ★ The state provides funding for teacher salaries through the BEP formula based on a salary unit cost per teacher. Because districts have flexibility in how to spend their BEP funding, increasing the salary unit cost does not necessarily mean each teacher will get a raise.
